God's Promises

The city of Nineveh is an example of God keeping his promises. Nineveh was the capital city of the Assyrian empire. It was located on the bank of the Tigris River in what is now Iraq. A huge city for its time, it had walls close to fifty feet high surrounding it. Nineveh was the cultural center of the known world. It had a huge library, hanging gardens, and probably the first aqueduct. They ruled over those around them with an iron fist. They had powerful armies and overbearing rulers known for their ruthlessness, cruelty, and idolatry. God sent Jonah to Nineveh and to Jonah's dismay, it worked. The city repented and was spared God's wrath.

Then time went by, and the people and rulers of Nineveh forgot God's kindness toward them. They again became just as bad as before. They were hated by those around them for their cruelty and oppression. They had captured the Northern Kingdom and were threatening Judah. Pretty much the whole book of Nahum is a warning to Nineveh.

Nahum 1:8 But with an overflowing flood

He will make an utter end of its place,

In 612 BC the Medes and Babylonians joined together to lay siege to the city. Their siege lasted for three months until rains and rising flood waters toppled a large section of the wall. The king did not want to be taken alive and burned himself and his family up in a huge funeral pyre. The people opened the gates, but they did not find mercy from their attackers. The city was completely destroyed. The ruins of the ancient city were excavated in 1845. They found the remains of the palace, the library.

and a huge part of the wall that had come down.

God keeps his promises. All of them. We should remember to fear the Lord because he will do what is right and keep his promises. Lucky for us, he promises us great things.
