Revealing God

Sacrifice of his Son

Being willing and able to sacrifice is a very challenging aspect of human life. We simply don't want to do without or give up things that we value. If we stop and reflect on life, we will find that it involves a lot of sacrifice to be successful in the things we do. Sacrifice makes us who we are.

Our father Abraham was confronted with this element of sacrifice in a very stunning way. After leaving his country and kindred as God told him, and then waiting all those years to have a son, Abraham is now asked to sacrifice his son. God tells him, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering upon one of the mountains of which I shall tell you" (Gen. 22:2). You got to be kidding! We may be willing to sacrifice a little here and a little there, but we would find it extremely difficult to sacrifice our only son. Abraham teaches us a valuable lesson, because he proceeds to do what God has told him to. Even young Isaac sees the conflict here, asking his father where the lamb for a burnt offering was. Abraham told him, "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering" (Gen. 22:8). As we travel through life and face those times of sacrifice, do we trust God to provide what is needed? How far are we willing to step out in faith? Abraham proceeded to build the altar and laid the wood on it, then bound Isaac and placed him on top. As he took the knife to slay his son, "the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven, and said... Do not lay your hand on the lad or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me" (Gen. 22:11). Then Abraham saw a ram, caught in a thicket and sacrificed it (vs. 13). Let us go forward in faith to present ourselves as "a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God" (Rom. 12:1). *Iantz*
