#### In Season or Out of Season

As the four Americans from Boerne, Texas were about to land in Iloilo City last Sept 14, the heavy rains welcomed them at the airport. The MOSES team had already been traveling for two to three days as well from across the country in heavy tropical rains.

From Iloilo airport, the entire MOSES team with Chris Palmer, Alex Duncan, Allen & Becky Lay headed west by land towards San Jose, Antique in a never ending downpour of rain. The weather bureau declared it as a severe tropical storm. As a team leader, I was anticipating what might happen in the mountain roads known for landslides and erosion. Every time we stopped, I always asked the local residents & motorists about the condition of the roads. I was ready to take the long route by the coast, however after getting enough information, I believed the mountain roads were passable and would save us several hours of travel.

As we arrived at the Merrace Resort Saturday night, where we had made reservations for the whole team to stay, cook, and hold the Gospel meetings at night, it was still pouring down rain. After the team worshiped that first Sunday morning, I prepared the whole team (50 Filipinos & 4 Americans) about how to interact with the prospects, what our evangelism would look like day to day, how we would divide in teams, and so forth. The pouring rain had never stopped. The rain & the winds were getting stronger. We could hear the waves crashing on the beach. The church planting campaign was supposed to start Monday morning. Some Filipinos & I were afraid the Americans thought we might cancel going house to house.

Based on my past experiences, I know the storm will turn out to be one of our greatest tools in church planting and sharing the gospel. Parents can not go to work if they are fishermen or farmers, so they will be in their homes. Government will shut down offices and schools. The majority of folks will be in their homes. I sent the ladies to the department store with the money we had collected from our church offering that morning and they bought 50 umbrellas!

Rain or shine, we were ready to go! The rain would not stop us, we would use the rain for good. We would go house to house, mornings & afternoons for several days in the pouring rain. We made so many contacts, the Filipinos dislike seeing folks walking in the rain, they are a very hospitable people, inviting us into their homes. We invited folks to the Gospel Meetings at night as well, not sure what kind of turnout we would get because of the rain, but each night we had more adults and kids come. Becky Lay and the ladies made impromptu Bible classes for the kids to attend while their parents attended the Gospel Meetings. We were blessed to have folks wanting to be baptized after the third day. The first couple of baptisms we had to do in a pool at the resort next door. The ocean waves were too big & strong for us to try and wade out in.

Through all the rain, wind, and storms, the 43<sup>rd</sup> church planting of San Jose, Antique sponsored by the Boerne Church of Christ was one of the most successful ones so far. God challenged a faithful team of 54 workers to go forth in spite of the circumstances and 18 beautiful people lives were changed. 18 souls were baptized and added to the kingdom and a new group of believers worship together each Sunday now.

I introduced to the young church to emulate Acts 2:42- to devote themselves to the apostles teachings, and to fellowship and to sharing meals together, and to prayer. We have two MOSES workers we left behind, Donald, his wife, Junevel, & their two young children, along with Darfren from Mindanao are living there now and following up on contacts and continuing to study with the young Christians. Jonah Nierve, a MOSES worker from Guimaras (nearby island) goes there from time to time to help Donald & Darfren with follow-up work as well. Every Sunday the young church always has a potluck lunch together, and we know the extra time spent together every week is helping them grow closer together as a family.

We are so thankful to the Boerne church for the sacrifices made to sponsor the church planting and send the team of four to labor in the field with our MOSES team. I know many were pushed out of the comfort zones going house to house during the tropical storm & monsoon rains, but God had a plan to use it to His glory, like the Psalmist says: "They that sow in tears shall reap in joy."
