A Willing Sacrifice

Being willing to sacrifice for the good of others is a precious attribute of our human lives. I got to experience the blessing sacrifice that can be early in life when my grandpa Jantz passed away. He was the only grandparent I knew, so he was very special to me. At that time, I was working with my dad at the Carrier Co-op, and it was a critical time after harvest. My dad was stressed about leaving the Co-op without anyone to run the elevators. Even though it meant the world to me to be at grandpa's funeral, I told dad that Carol and I would go down and pay our last respects ahead of time so I could be at the Co-op while he was gone. My dad's face lit up and he was at peace. What a special moment that was for me.

Our heavenly Father was faced with a very difficult situation when the precious people he created kept falling away into sin. The animal sacrifices they were making was not keeping them on the pathway of righteousness. You have to know that this created a tremendous stress for God as he prepared to send his working partner to rescue them. When Jesus chose to be **a willing sacrifice**, it put a smile on his Father's face and gave him much needed peace. Jesus tells us, "For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life, that I may take it again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own accord; I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again; this charge I have received from my Father" (Jn. 10:17-18). His being **a willing sacrifice** lifted a heavy burden from the Father and covered the sins of God's people for all time. The Hebrews writer affirms this. "For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified" (Heb. 10:14). We are indeed blessed when we sacrifice for the good of others, and by the sacrifice Jesus made for us.
