A Spiritual Journey Spiritual Conduct

How we conduct ourselves as we journey through life is a very important part of who we are. Our parents molded our conduct during our formative years through their loving guidance and discipline. It helped shape who we became and how we touch the lives of those around us. Our daily conduct comes down to the choices we make; do we follow the guidance we have been given and learn from the discipline we have received, or do we ignore all that and follow the evil ways of the world?

God also places a lot of importance on our **spiritual conduct**, just as our parents did. He wants us to be the people he created us to be and to have an enduring intimate relationship with him. That is why he also disciplines us out of his great love. *"My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor lose courage when you are punished by him. For the Lord disciplines him whom he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives"* (Heb. 12:5-6). You see, *"There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death"* (Prov. 16:25). As we go forth on our spiritual journey, we need to be mindful of making the right choices so our conduct is in harmony with God's will and is also pleasing to him. Why? Because he will discipline us if we don't. We must always be thankful that God disciplines our **spiritual conduct** out of his love for us before it is everlasting too late. He desires to keep us on the pathway of righteousness so we can be a light unto the world. Jesus tells us, *"By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another"* (Jn. 13:35). That is the **spiritual conduct** we want to be known by; that is how we make a difference in the world; that is how we bring others to the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Love is a powerful force as it molds our **spiritual conduct** to be like God.
