Sermon Scripture: John 7:24

Sermon Thought:

You've heard it before, "The Bible says, 'Do not judge.'" Yes, that is correct, the Bible does say that. However, that is only the first 3 words in that teaching. Looking at Jesus' teaching on judging, a better verse would be what John records in 7:24, "judge correctly." This sermon looks at how we can go about judging correctly.

2. The sermon gave 5 criteria to help us judge correctly. Which do you find difficult?
3. What are the benefits (to self, to others, to the church, etc.) of judging correctly?

Revealing God
Trusting God to Deliver Us

Our transitions in life are abundant as we move from an infant to adult life and beyond. In the beginning we are totally dependent on our parents to care for our every need. As we grow and acquire new abilities, we move away from parental care and begin doing things on our own. This transition is without fear, because we still have no knowledge of the things that can harm us. We then learn that some of the choices we make and the world events that confront us can be dangerous to our lives. It is during these times when we earnestly desire to have someone who can deliver us.

God well understood the transitions we would go through, and as our heavenly Father, he is always ready to deliver us. These times of human need are seen in the lament psalms. We cry out, "How long must I bear pain in my soul, and have sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?" (Ps. 13:2). Does that sound familiar? As we reflect on our life's journey, we find many situations where those words would testify of the perils we faced. It is during those times when we must give ourselves to **trusting God to deliver us**. That is certainly what the psalmist does as he looks beyond the things that are threatening to harm him. He says, "but I have trusted in thy steadfast love, O Lord my God; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation. I will sing to the Lord, because he has dealt bountifully with me" (Ps. 13:5-6). The God who created us and gave us the breath of life certainly knows our every need. The psalmist assures us of this fact as he writes, "O Lord, thou hast searched me and known me!... Thou knowest me right well" (Ps. 139:1 & 14). **Trusting God to deliver us** gives us the confidence we need to overcome those times of adverse transition we will encounter on our life's journey.
