Revealing God

The Lord is My Shepherd

The unknowns are a reality in our everyday life. We do not know what tomorrow will bring and what the future holds. So, how do we embrace the unknowns that lie before us? We simply press on and do what we can, while making the necessary adjustments for the unknowns we encounter. God has given us the ability to make wise decisions and changes to accomplish the things we desire. The wisdom of Solomon tells us, "A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps" (Prov. 16:9).

The psalmist testifies to this reality as he writes, "*The Lord is my shepherd*" (Ps. 23:1). When we take to heart that the Lord is with us as we move forward in a world of unknowns, then we can be confident that everything will work out for us. We can then say with the psalmist, "*I shall not want*." The Lord does not want us to worry about the unknowns in life. He takes our hand and "makes us lie down in green pastures." He walks with us and "leads us besides still waters" (vs 2). The Lord does this because he cares for us and wants the very best for our journey through life. He "restores our soul and leads us in paths of righteousness" (vs3). Why would he do all of that for us? Because he desires that our lives reflect his created purpose for us – "for his name's sake." When the Lord is our shepherd, we will be able to overcome the world of unknowns and bring glory to his name. As Jesus tells us, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). That means we can step out in faith knowing the Lord is leading us and helping us embrace our daily unknowns. As we do, "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Ps. 23:6). Praise God he is the Shepherd keeping watch over our souls!
