Revealing God – The Lord's Church The Bride of Christ

As a minister in the Lord's Church, I performed a number of wedding ceremonies. It was always a touching moment when the bride came down the aisle, dressed in her beautiful white gown and beaming with the radiance of her love. Marriage is truly a "God moment," when two lives become one. Everyone present is changed by this sacred ceremony. This blending of two lives into one is how we fulfill God's plan for human life.

The Lord's Church is the fulfillment of our spiritual destiny – our heavenly home with God. John captures the divine essence of **the Bride of Christ**. "And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband" (Rev. 21:2). The beauty, the radiance, and the eternal joy make it a memorable moment to be part of. John again tells us, "Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to be clothed with fine linen, bright and pure – for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints" (Rev. 19:7-8). Let us never doubt that the Lord's Church, as **the Bride of Christ**, is our life! It is how we become one with the Father and the Son. Jesus testifies to this in his prayer to the Father. "The glory which thou hast given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one" (Jn. 17:22). Praise God we share in the radiant glory of **the Bride of Christ** walking down the aisles of heaven. "The Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come.' Let him who hears say, 'Come'... He who testifies to these things says, 'Surely I am coming soon.' Amen. Come, Lord Jesus! (Rev. 22:17 & 20).
